#### Don't Skip the Spuds:

Idaho Potatoes Can Be Part of a Healthy Diabetes Meal

(NewsUSA) - Diabetes remains a growing health crisis in the United States, but many people living with diabetes are confused as to which foods should be part of their meal plan, according to the American Diabetes Association (ADA). For example, many people believe that those with diabetes or prediabetes should avoid potatoes, but in fact potatoes are highly nutritious and can be part of any healthy diet.

"We want those living with diabetes and prediabetes to feel confident eating potatoes with their breakfast, lunch or dinner as long as serving size and preparation recommendations are followed," according to Jamey Higham, president and CEO of the Idaho Potato Commission. "This partnership aims to enhance people's understanding of nutrition, especially carbohydrates, help build healthy eating habits and debunk some myths about potatoes and diabe-

The ADA's Better Choices for Life program uses the ADA's evidence-based guidelines and perspective to help consumers make informed choices about food purchases. Participating products display the Better Choices for Life mark on their packaging. In the coming months, this mark will appear on select 5-lb and 10-lb bags of fresh Idaho® potatoes.

The Diabetes Plate is one way the ADA educates people with diabetes about healthy eating.

This simple plan shows how to put together a meal that consists of vegetables, protein, and carbohydrates, which can include potatoes.

#### **The Diabetes Plate:**

Step 1: Fill half your nine-inch plate with non-starchy vegetables.



Non-starchy vegetables are low in carbohydrates, so they have less impact on blood glucose.

Step 2: Fill one-quarter of your plate with lean protein, such as fish, chicken, lean beef, soy products, and cheese.

Step 3: Fill the last quarter of your plate with carbohydrate foods, such as starchy vegetables, beans and legumes, grains, fruit, and low-fat dairy products.

Step 4: Drink water or another zero-calorie beverage.

Step 5: Choose healthy fats in small amounts.

Potatoes are a starchy vegetable and can be a selection for the carbohydrate section of the Diabetes Plate. They are considered a superfood by many nutritionists because they contain potassium, vitamin C, and fiber. In addition, one 5.3ounce potato has 110 calories, contains no sodium, and is naturally gluten-free and free of saturated

Of course, preparation matters. Tips for healthy potato preparation include baking or boiling instead of frying, keeping the skins on for extra fiber, and using healthy oils when needed, such as avocado oil or extra virgin olive oil.



# Serve and protect

On September 25th the Fairfield County Sheriff's Office implemented their new 911


When a 911 supervisor from the Fairfield County Sheriff's Office attended a vendor show, he saw that another sheriff's office in Guernsey County implementing a new 911 system. He was so impressed by the Guernsey County system, that the Fairfield County Sheriff's Office traveled an hour and a half away to participate in the demo program. During the visit, the Fairfield County dispatchers got to witness a medic run where a child had fallen. The Guernsey County Sheriff's office was able to access the mom's cell phone to check on the status of the child, and luckily the child was okay.

The new 911 system can help people who are out hiking and get injured. When the hiker calls 911, the dispatcher can send them a temporary link to help the dispatcher find nearby landmarks to send help to the injured hiker. This new system is also good for people passing through our county. If they are involved in a car accident and don't know where they are at, they can click on a link sent by the dispatcher and the new technology will send the dispatch center the person's coordinates.

If someone is experiencing a domestic violence situation, the victim can give the dispatcher temporary access to their phone. The dispatcher can assess the situation and send help to the victim. The dispatcher can send still shots and video to the deputy who is responding to the call, so they are aware of the situation they are responding to. If there is a fire, the dispatcher can send a link to the fire department and the fire department can size up the scene to know if they need to take additional equipment.

The new 911 system also provides a transcription and service, translation translates 11 to 13 languages. When an operator gets a call, the computer transcribes the call. This allows the operator to gain important information quickly, such as a caller trying to name off a license plate. This is a piece of information that if not taken quickly, can be lost in a matter of seconds. Now there is a written record so nothing is lost.

Even though English is the primary language spoken in Fairfield County, the county of 159,000 people is made up of 5

USA (2022), the five largest ethnic groups in Fairfield County White (Non-Hispanic) (83.1%), Black or African (Non-Hispanic) American (8.38%), Two+ (Non-Hispanic) (3.48%), Asian (Non-Hispanic) (2.19%), and Other (Hispanic) (0.932%).

Elizabeth Maple (Communications Supervisor at the Fairfield County Sheriff's Office), shares that by 2025 the goal is for all emergency call centers in Ohio to be connected, so that information can be sent back and forth across the state of Ohio. Then the goal will be to connect all emergency call centers across the country. Elizabeth explains, "If we don't keep up with technology, we will fall behind. We are lucky because administration commissioners see the value in staying current with technology, to offer the best service to our

Implementing a new 911 system doesn't happen overnight. The Fairfield County Sheriff's Office has been working behind the scenes on this new technology for over a year. They have been busy upgrading technology, getting high speed internet, upgrading servers, and doing site visits and team meetings with Carbyne.

Carbyne is a software company that develops cloud based end-to-end mission critical contact center solutions. Their mission is to save lives, maximize

ethnic groups. According to Data efficiency and minimize response times for emergency call takers. The company provides the most advanced technology ecosystem for emergency call handling in the market. Carbyne's technology acts as the gateway for delivering rich and smart data from any device into emergency contact

> Implementing new technology is scary and never easy, but the Carbyne team helped the Fairfield County Sheriff's Office with any hurdles they faced. They did online trainings, on-site trainings and lots of trouble shooting, when things didn't go as smoothly as they planned. Another important part of implementing something new, is to provide employees everything they need to do their job effectively. Maple adds, "You can't be in this industry and not expect change. 911 dispatchers are really resilient and they adapt readily in order to provide lifesaving services." All of the dispatchers' hard work has paid off, and other agencies are wanting to come and see how to implement their own new and improved 911 system.

> Sheriff Alex Lape, of the Fairfield County Sheriff's Office, is always striving to do what is best for his employees and the residents of Fairfield County. He shares, "In the ongoing effort to better serve Fairfield County residents, these current technological improvements keep pace with and surpass the requirements for next generation 911 services."













## Choosing the Thanksgiving Turkey... How Much to Buy?

Buy about one pound per person, or a pound and a half per person if you have hearty eaters or want plenty for leftovers. If you are serving more than one type of meat, you should probably buy the lesser amount.

For large gatherings where there will be a combination of adults and children, figure one pound per person to allow for the large and smaller appetites. If the turkey is pre-stuffed allow 1 1/2 pounds per person. Buy 1/2 pound per person for bone-in turkey breast.

Fresh or Frozen - A frozen turkey can be bought months ahead and stored in the freezer but a fresh turkey should be bought only one to two days ahead. Fresh turkeys may be frozen for up to 12 months.

There are basically two types of raw frozen turkeys on the market – pre-basted or un-basted. A pre-basted bird is injected with water, broth, vegetable oil and/or spices to enhance flavor and moistness during cooking. An unbasted turkey has no additional ingredients. Read the label.

Look for the USDA Grade A symbol on the label. Grade A turkeys are of the highest quality. Source: University of Illinois Extension

#### Giving Back to Local Children in Need





Several years ago, we started a garage door service company called Dr. Door Company. I tried to stay behind-the-scenes with the company, designing our social media posts and helping with the day-to-day operations, but immediately knew this was one area where I could provide more insight. Having been a teacher in Fairfield County for the last ten years, I knew first-hand that winter is a very difficult time for some families. I often saw children who didn't have winter coats or gloves due to circumstances beyond their control, and I carried those children in my heart. Knowing that we had local families who could use our help, I suggested Tyler contact Job and Family Services to see what they needed from us.



Job and Family Services was more than willing to work with us and explained that they are in need of new blankets, children's winter coats, hats, gloves, and pajamas for children of all ages. Armed with the information we needed, Dr. Door setup drop-off boxes at various locations in the Lancaster community and our drive has continued to grow each year.
