Local cycling group gives away bikes for kids



Celebrating the 1,000th bike gifted submitted

Bike Buckeye Lake, organizers of the popular Tour de Buckeye Lake cycling event, will give away close to 200 bikes and helmets to economicallydisadvantaged children this Christmas. The gifts are part of the Christmas Bike Giveaway, a program created by the volunteerled organization and funded by donations from community members. The group has given away over 1,000 bikes since the program began in 2015.

Bike Buckeye Lake works with local schools and Job and Family organizations Services Fairfield, Licking and Perry counties to identify children who would benefit from receiving a new bike.

Organization president, Terry Fischer, notes that "the program's success has only been possible through the tireless efforts of our volunteers and the generosity of the many donors and sponsors

who help make the holiday a little brighter for families in our community."

Fischer says that the bikes and helmets cost an average of \$130 per child and encourages those interested in donating to visit https://bikebuckeyelake.org/bikefor-kids/.

Bike Buckeye Lake is a volunteer-run 501(c)3 non-profit organization founded in 2015 to foster healthy, vibrant and sustainable communities. group promotes the creation of safe trails that connect towns and points of interest around Buckeye Lake. The goal is to make walking, running and cycling safe, convenient, and accessible for residents and visitors to the lake.

In addition to the Bike Giveaway, the group organizes the Tour de Buckeye Lake and the Tri-County Kids' Bike Safety Rodeo. The Rodeo, which premiered in May 2024, gives children an opportunity to learn bike handling and safety skills as they guide their bikes through a course made up of more than a dozen stations. The Tour, a cycling event for riders of all skill levels, takes place annually on the third Saturday of August. In 2024, the event attracted more than 800 cyclists to the region. Proceeds go to support trail development costs around Buckeye Lake relating to, for example, land leases and acquisition, engineers consultants, safety, grant applications, and maintenance.



Schaffer announces funding for mental health and agriculture

COLUMBUS - State Senator
Tim Schaffer (R-Lancaster)
announced the Ohio Controlling
Board approved funds for
supportive housing in Fairfield
County and new equipment for
pesticide testing at the Ohio
Department of Agriculture.

The Fairfield County ADAMH Board will receive \$1 million to construct 24 units of permanent supportive housing for adults facing homelessness and who are suffering from mental health and substance use disorders. The board will also provide services at the site.

"These dollars will help numerous Fairfield County residents move forward towards success," Schaffer said. "I am

The Controlling Board also approved a \$743,035.58 request from the Ohio Department of Agriculture for new equipment at its Consumer Protection Laboratory, which protects Ohioans from the misuse and misapplication of pesticides that can damage health and our food supply. The new tools will replace older instruments that are no longer supported by the manufacturer.

"The Ohio Department of Agriculture fulfills a critical mission in our state, and these new tools will ensure they keep our farmers and our citizens safe," said Schaffer.



Keeping pets safe and healthy during the holidays

When owning a pet, there are many things to keep in mind during the holiday season. One of the most important things to be aware of is keeping harmful foods away from your pets. The Morris Animal Foundation (2023) warns that pet owners should keep their pets away from the following foods: Chocolate (Theobromine and caffeine), Macadamia nuts, bread dough, grapes and raisins (kidney failure),

cream of tartar (kidney failure), high-fat foods such as turkey skin can cause pancreatitis, which is severe and sometimes fatal, Xylitol and other items in your purse (even small amounts) can cause liver damage and drops in blood sugar. Also, keep medication bottles and items like hand sanitizers out of reach of pets. Alcohol (just a few sips can intoxicate pets)

Not only is food a thing to be aware of around the holidays, but so are all the decorations that come

with the Christmas season. When putting up your tree, make sure you secure your tree to the ceiling or doorway using a fishing line. When adding lights to the tree, wrap the lights as tight as possible to the tree to limit the dangling temptation for cats, and cover any cords leading from the tree to the outlet. Watch pets to make sure they aren't chewing on cords, which could cause them to be burned. Adding ornaments to trees can be another hazard. Make sure glass ornaments

and homemade ornaments are up high. Broken glass ornaments can cause injuries, and ornaments made out of salt-dough or other foodbased materials can be toxic if eaten. Consider putting tinsel on just the top part of the tree, since it could be ingested and cause an intestinal blockage.

If putting up a real tree, lifestyle expert Mar Jennings (2024) warns that tree fertilizer can leak into the tree holder. This will make dogs and cats very ill if they drink from it.



Also, adding anything to the water to extend the life of the tree (like aspirin) can also be harmful to household pets.
